

Recovering your treatment and analysing your prescriptions enable us to secure your medical care and to control potential risks due to:

- balance disruption of a suitable treatment ;
- brutal interruption of one treatment ;
- overdosage or medical interactions in case of self medication ;
- confusion between generics and originators.

It also gives us the possibility to meet regulatory requirements:

- no drug must be put or kept at patient's disposal if not prescribed and distributed by the health establishment. At arrival, patient's personal treatment will be withdrawn unless an explicit consent is mentioned by the prescriber.
- all usual personal treatment administered to the patient during his hospitalisation is included in the hospitalisation cost. It cannot be financially assumed by the patient nor the health insurance.



Never take your personal treatment during hospitalisation without the consent of the doctor !...

Doctors and nurses recover your personal treatment and prescriptions related to your ongoing treatment.



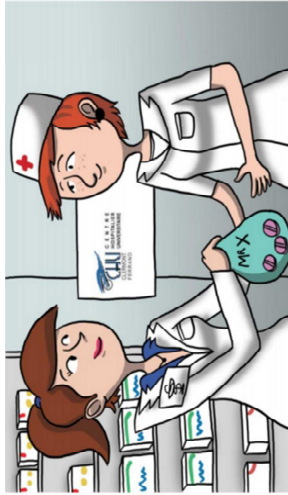
During your hospitalisation



Your personal treatment is individually and nominately stored.



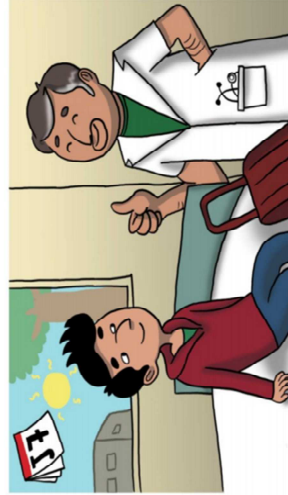
Your usual treatment can be modified as doctors reassess it according to your state of health.

Personal prescriptions and treatment are given back to you if still prescribed by doctors. **With your consent**, prescriptions and treatment which are not re-prescribed will be destructured in order to prevent mistakes and confusion.
